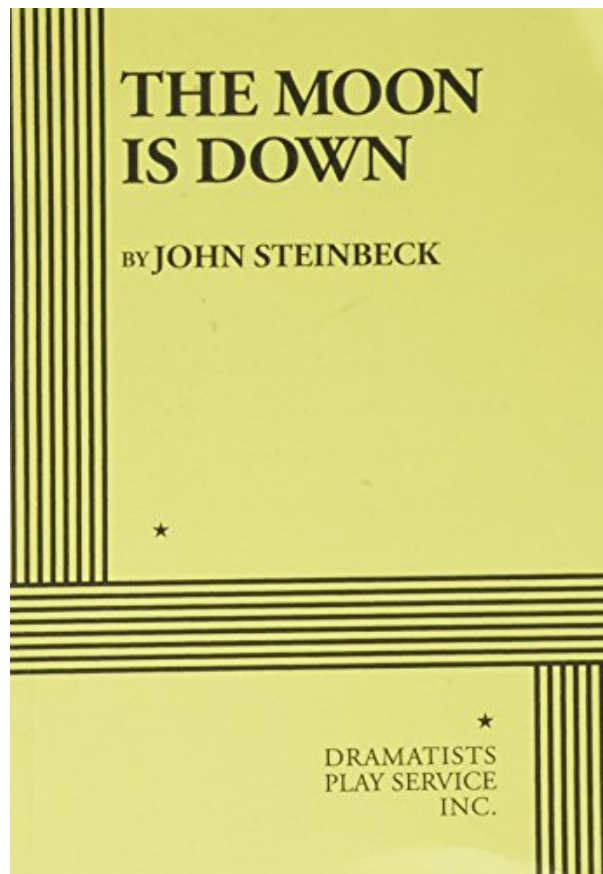
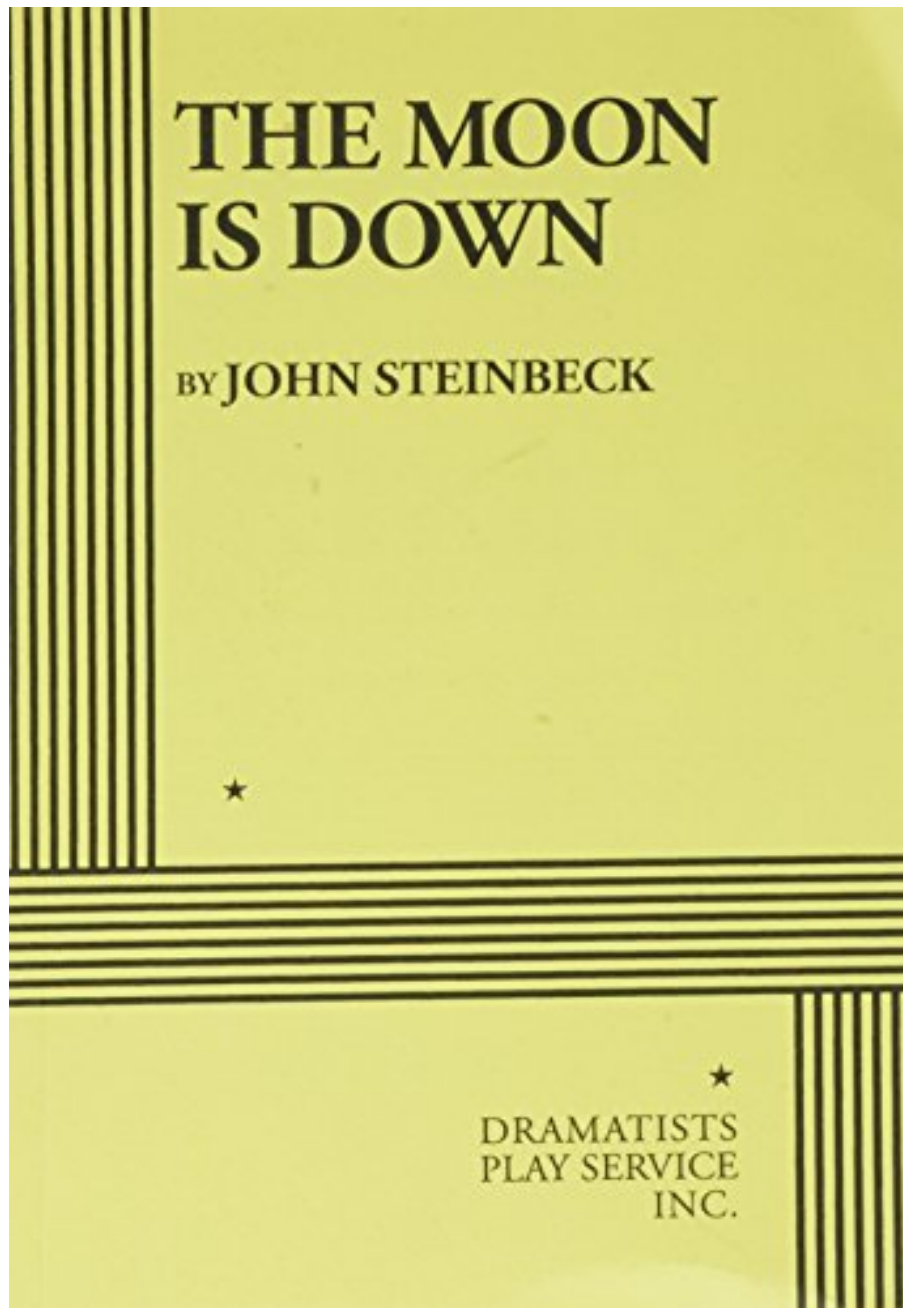

This book was chosen by a member of our book club and I found it to be very engaging and extremely thought provoking. Since it was meant to be a work of propaganda for those in Europe under Nazi control, and was later criticized for not being critical enough of the Nazi soldiers, it was very intriguing. In the end, it was very popular to the audience it was meant to uplift and I completely understand why it was! It is not a "feel good" book, but it reflects the patriotism and the strength an oppressed civilization can have when an oppressor tries to completely break them. I found the Nazi characters also very interesting as it seemed realistic that some of them, I'm sure, were not happy with their roles in that war either. The soldiers, in some cases, were very unhappy in that they didn't have a choice but to carry out the orders of their maniacal leader.
